STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY

AN ACT Appropriating Moneys to Carry Out Duties of the Legislative Research Committee.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the duties and functions of the Legislative Research Committee are a direct obligation of the State; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary so that the Legislative Research Committee may continue to carry out its duties and functions in a proper manner; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Research Committee the sum of \$13,000 to carry out the duties and functions of the Legislative Research Committee. The breakdown of expenditures shall be as follows:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
