STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY

AN ACT Relating to Eligibility of Bangor City Councilors for Certain City Government Offices.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the best interests of the inhabitants of the City of Bangor require that the charter of the City of Bangor be clarified as to the eligibility of city councilors for certain offices within the city government; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1931, c. 54, Art. VII, § 1, repealed and replaced. Section 1 of Article VII of chapter 54 of the private and special laws of 1931 is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
- Sec. 1. Members of the city council ineligible for certain offices. No member of the city council shall be apointed to any other office the salary of which is payable by the city. No member of the city council shall, during the term for which he was chosen, be appointed to any salaried city office which shall have been created during such term.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
