#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY

AN ACT Providing for a Chief Administrative Officer of and Increasing Salaries of County Commissioners of Androscoggin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 2, amended. That part of section 2 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, which relates to Androscoggin County, as amended, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Androscoggin County: County commissioners, \$3,000; chairman, \$3,600; one associate, \$3,000, except that one member of the board, to be designated by the board, shall devote each full working day to his duties including superintendence of the county buildings as chief administrative officer, shall receive annually the sum of \$9,500; clerk of courts, \$8,600; full-time county attorney \$12,000; first assistant county attorney, \$5,500; second assistant county attorney, \$4,500; county treasurer, \$6,050; sheriff, \$8,000; register of deeds, \$6,800; judge of probate, \$6,000; register of probate, \$6,200.

The board of county commissioners of said county shall be authorized to transfer money for compensation, traveling or budget from the contingent account.
