**AN ACT Appropriating Funds for Union River
Anadromous Fish Restoration Program.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund, in favor of the Atlantic Sea-Run Salmon Commission, the sum of \$25,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1971 and the sum of \$16,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972, to carry out a program of anadromous fish restoration in the waters of the Union River Bay and estuary. All unexpended balances shall not lapse, but shall remain a continuing account, until June 30, 1973.

The appropriations are contingent upon additional moneys being provided, from local sources or whatever sources the Atlantic Sea-Run Salmon Commission may find available in the amount of \$10,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1971 and \$8,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972, to supplement the state's contribution to complete the program. Federal funds may not be used in place of local matching money.
