STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY

AN ACT Relating to Fee for and Facilities of Class A Restaurants Serving Malt Liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 28, § 2, sub-§ 18, amended. Subsection 18 of section 2 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding at the end the following new sentence:

Class A restaurants licensed to serve malt liquor only shall have facilities to serve 60% of seating capacity at one time, the type or nature of facilities shall be left to the discretion of the individual licensee.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 28, § 701, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 701 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 54 of chapter 513 of the public laws of 1965 and as amended, is further amended by inserting after the 11th line the following:

Restaurant, class A-Malt liquor.....400.00
