STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY

AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Violations by Guides Under Fish and Game Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2053, amended. The 10th paragraph of section 2053 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as last repealed and replaced by section 2 of chapter 241 of the public laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

Whenever a guide is convicted of having violated any provisions of the inland fish and game laws, or any of the rules and regulations established by the commissioner for the licensing of guides, said commissioner shall may suspend a guide's license for 2 years and shall may deny the right to hunt or fish for 2 years.
