STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
AND SEVENTY

AN ACT Relating to Difference of Student Tuition Between University of
Maine and the State Colleges.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1865, c. 532, § 4-E, repealed and replaced. Section 4-E of chapter 532 of the private and special laws of 1865, as enacted by section 3 of chapter 229 of the private and special laws of 1967, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Sec. 4-E. Student tuition. The 1968-1969 apportionate difference in student tuition between the present University of Maine and the present state colleges shall be maintained through the academic year 1971-1972 for those students who were enrolled in the University System as of September 30, 1968.
