SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 24, L. D. 52, Bill, "AN
ACT Regulating the Operation of Snowmobiles in Unorganized Territory
During Deer Season."

Amend said Bill by striking out everything after the amending
clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'§ 1986. Unorganized territory during hunting season

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a snowmobile
in the forests or forest lands or upon the waters or ice in any
unorganized territory of this State during the open season on deer.
This section shall not apply on Sunday, to a law enforcement officer
while acting in the line of duty, in carrying out search and rescue
missions, or any person going directly to or from a hunting camp
or lodge when other vehicular travel is impractical or impossible,
or as provided in section 1985.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to add forest lands to the
bill and to permit persons to travel to hunting camps when other
vehicular travel is impossible.
