AN ACT Relating to Daily Bag Limit of Certain Fish Taken by Ice Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2553, amended. The 4th paragraph of section 2553 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 2 of chapter 317 of the public laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

In waters open to ice fishing no person shall take, catch or kill in any one day or have in possession at any time more than $5\ 7\frac{1}{2}$ pounds in the aggregate of the trout, salmon, togue and black bass species unless the last fish caught increases the combined weight to more than $5\ 7\frac{1}{2}$ pounds.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide a daily bag limit by ice fishing that will be the same as summer fishing.
