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**AN ACT Repealing the Requirement of Notarizing Applications for Liquor  
Licenses.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 28, § 251, amended.** The 2nd sentence of section 251 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

**Intentionally untruthful answers in applications for licenses shall constitute the crime of perjury.**

STATEMENT OF FACT

By eliminating the necessity of notarizing applications for liquor licenses, this bill will eliminate "red tape" and mailing costs.
