STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Repealing the Requirement of Notarizing Applications for Liquor . Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 251, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 251 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Intentionally untruthful answers in applications for licenses shall constitute the crime of perjury.

STATEMENT OF FACT

By eliminating the necessity of notarizing applications for liquor licenses, this bill will eliminate "red tape" and mailing costs.
