SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 64, L.D. 105, Bill, "AN ACT Providing for Hunter-Orange Garments When Hunting.

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the Title and inserting in place thereof the following:

'AN ACT Relating to the Wearing of Fluorescent Clothing When Hunting in the Southern Zone for Two Years.'

Further amend said Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'R. S., T. 12, §2468, amended. Section 2468 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 405 of the public laws of 1967 and repealed and replaced by chapter 226 of the public laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

§2468. Fluorescent clothing

Any person while hunting with firearms in that area of the State south of U. S. Route 2 and west of the Kennebec River during the ~~1969~~ 1971 and ~~1970~~ 1972 deer hunting season except when hunting waterfowl from a boat or blind, shall wear fluorescent, orange clothing which is visible from all sides.'
