STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Requiring Referendum Elections on Certain Municipal Public Works Appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 30, § 5103, sub-§ 1, repaled and replaced. Subsection 1 of section 5103 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
- 1. Parks and construction projects. Providing for public buildings, ways, bridges, parks, parking places and sewers and drains, subject to the following conditions:
 - A. No money shall be raised or appropriated for any public works project provided for in this subsection in any city until a majority of the legal voters, present and voting, at any regular or special election so vote, and shall not be raised or appropriated in any town until an article in a town warrant so providing shall have been adopted at an annual or special town meeting.
 - B. If a public works project, as provided for in this subsection, shall cost an amount not to exceed 10% of the indebtedness limitation set for the municipality by the Constitution of the State of Maine, Article X, section 15, paragraph A shall not apply.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill would require certain public works projects to be approved by the voters in a referendum election before a municipality could legally raise or appropriate money to finance them.
