STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Possession of Trout.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2553, amended. The 1st sentence of the 4th paragraph from the end of section 2553 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 21 of chapter 448 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:

No persons shall have in his possession any salmon, trout togue or black bass with the heads and tails, or either, detached therefrom unless such fish are being prepared for immediate cooking.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The present law makes illegal the possession of certain fish with the heads and tails, or either, detached. The purpose of this bill is to remove trout from the list of fish.
