## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 105th LEGISLATURE

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 115, L.D. 159, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Carrying Life Saving Devices in Canoes."

Amend said Bill by inserting at the beginning of the first line after the enacting clause the abbreviation and figure 'Sec. 1.'

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end, before the Statement of Fact, the following:

'Sec. 2. R. S., T. 38, §238, sub-§1, ¶E, additional. Subsection 1 of section 238 of Title 38 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 1 of chapter 243 of the public laws of 1969, is amended by adding a new paragraph E, to read as follows:

E. Canoes, owned by a boys' or girls' summer camp located upon inland waters in Maine and duly licensed by the Department of Health and Welfare, utilized by campers under the direction and supervision of a camp counselor, at least 18 years of age, during training and instruction periods on waters adjacent to the main camp within a distance of 500 feet from the shoreline of such camp shall be exempt from this subsection.'

## Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to exempt canoes during instructional periods by licensed camps.
