HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 149, L. D. 204, Bill, "AN Act Providing Professional Immunity to Certain Persons in Emergency Cases."

Amend said Bill in the Title by striking out the words "Certain Persons" and inserting in place thereof the word 'Nurses'

Further amend said Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the Statement of Fact and inserting in place thereof the following:

'R. S., T. 32, § 2108, additional. Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2108, to read as follows:

§ 2108. Immunity

A nurse, licensed under this chapter, who in good faith renders emergency care at the scene of an emergency outside of a health care facility shall not be liable for any civil damages as a result of acts or omissions by him in rendering the emergency care, except acts amounting to willful or wanton misconduct.'
