RESOLVE, Dividing the State of Maine into Councillor Districts.

Apportionment Executive Councillor Districts. Resolved: That for the years 1973 to and including the year 1982, the State is divided into 7 Councillor Districts, each of which districts shall be entitled to one councillor to be chosen in the manner prescribed by the Constitution and laws of the State, as follows:

- First District: York, 1973-1974; 1975-1976; 1981-1982.
Oxford, 1977-1978; 1979-1980.
- Second District: Cumberland, one for each year.
- Third District: Sagadahoc, 1973-1974.
Androscoggin, 1975-1976; 1979-1980; 1981-1982.
Franklin, 1977-1978.
- Fourth District: Somerset, 1973-1974; 1975-1976.
Kennebec, 1977-1978; 1979-1980; 1981-1982.
- Fifth District: Lincoln, 1973-1974.
Waldo, 1975-1976.
Hancock, 1977-1978; 1979-1980.
Knox, 1981-1982.
- Sixth District: Piscataquis, 1973-1974.
Penobscot, 1975-1976; 1977-1978; 1979-1980; 1981-1982.
- Seventh District: Washington, 1973-1974; 1975-1976.
Aroostook, 1977-1978; 1979-1980; 1981-1982.
