STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Expressing the Legislative Intent in Construction of an East-West Highway.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

East-West Highway; legislative intent. It is the Legislature's intent that the type of highway, if and when the East-West Highway is constructed, shall be a free, 4-lane, limited-access road of interstate highway design extending from a 4-lane international bridge near the Calais Country Club and proceeding west to I95 at Bangor and from I95 at Pittsfield west to Farmington Falls, Livermore Falls, Norway to Fryeburg with spurs from

- 1. East Holden to Mt. Desert Island Bridge.
- 2. Farmington Falls to Bowmantown, Maine.
- 3. Fryeburg to Portland.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to express the Legislature's intent that when an East-West highway is constructed it shall be with a free, 4-lane, limited-access road of interstate highway design.
