# STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Increasing Fees for Inspection of Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 29, § 2122, amended. The 3rd paragraph of section 2122 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The Chief of the State Police or any member of the State Police may at any time upon reasonable grounds to believe that a vehicle is unsafe or not equipped as required by law, or that its equipment is not in proper adjustment or repair, require the driver of such vehicle to proceed to an official inspection station and submit such vehicle to an inspection and such tests as may be appropriate. The \$1 \$2 fee as required by law for semiannual inspection shall not apply in such case.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 29, § 2125, amended. Section 2125 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 9 of chapter 248 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:

#### § 2125. Fees

The operator of any official inspection station, or his agent, shall conduct the inspection of motor vehicles presented to him for that purpose in accordance with section 2122 and with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Chief of the State Police, for which he shall receive a fee of  $\$_{T}$   $\$_{2}$  for each car inspected, this sum not to include labor or material used in correction of faults in equipment.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to increase the inspection fees for motor vehicles from \$1 to \$2.
