STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Employment of a Legislator Following His Term in Office.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 3, § 5, additional. Title 3 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 5 to read as follows:

§ 5. As employee or legislative agent

No member of the Legislature shall be employed by the State or as a legislative counsel or agent for a period of 5 years following the expiration of his term in office.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the intent of this legislation to preclude legislators from advantage in gaining state employment or acting as counsel or agent as a result of their term in office.
