STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Persons Ineligible to Serve as Election Officials.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 21, § 533, sub-§ 3, amended. Subsection 3 of section 533 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

3. **Candidate or spouse, his mother, father, sister or brother.** A candidate or his spouse or his mother, father, sister or brother.

A. Exception. This does not apply to a candidate for warden or ward clerk or his spouse.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to make ineligible a candidate's mother, father, sister or brother to serve as an election official.
