AN ACT Relating to Use of Power Boats on Long Pond, Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 38, § 244, amended. Section 244 of Title 38 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 99 of chapter 544 of the public laws of 1967, is amended to read as follows:

§ 244. Eagle Lake, Jordan Pond and Long Pond; use of power boats

No person, except officers empowered to enforce this subchapter, shall operate a motorboat having more than 10 horsepower on Eagle Lake and Jordan Pond, Mt. Desert Island, Hancock County and Long Pond, T. E. and T. D., Franklin County.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Long Pond is a small pond in Western Franklin County and the camp owners would like to keep the surroundings tranquil and safe by keeping out large horsepower motors.
