**AN ACT to Authorize Augusta Water District and Augusta Sanitary District
to Exchange Customer Accounting Records.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1903, c. 334, § 11-A, additional. Chapter 334 of the private and special laws of 1903, as amended, is further amended by adding a new section 11-A, to read as follows:

Sec. 11-A. Customer accounting records. The officers of this district are authorized from time to time to furnish to and to receive from Augusta Sanitary District customer accounting records and information of each party to be used in connection with calculation of rates, billings and other financial requirements of the district and to pay and receive fair charges therefor.

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1955, c. 139, § 22, additional. Chapter 139 of the private and special laws of 1955, as amended, is further amended by adding a new section 22, to read as follows:

Sec. 22. Customer accounting records. The officers of this district are authorized from time to time to furnish to and to receive from Augusta Water District customer accounting records and information of each party to be used in connection with calculation of rates, billings and other financial requirements of the district and to pay and receive fair charges therefor.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to permit the Augusta Water District and Augusta Sanitary District to exchange information in their records since many sewer rates are now based upon water consumption figures.
