STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Holding Examinations to Practice Barbering.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 32, § 405, amended. The first sentence of section 405 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The board shall hold at least \neq 4 public examinations each year, at such times and places as it shall designate.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to enable students to take examinations for barbering nearer to the time of completion of their required student hours.
