STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Providing for Full-time Offices for Registration and Licenses for Operation of Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 29, § 51-A, additional. Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 51-A, to read as follows:

§ 51-A. Offices

The Secretary of State shall maintain 4 full-time offices at convenient places in the State as he deems necessary to carry out his duties relating to applications for registration of and licenses for the operation of motor vehicles.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Highway Fund to the Secretary of State, Motor Vehicle Division, the sum of \$191,106 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:
