**AN ACT Relating to Expenditure of Municipal Funds for Roads  
Used by Nonresidents.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 30, § 5103, sub-§ 7, additional.** Section 5103 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 88 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended by adding a new subsection 7 to read as follows:

**7. Roads. Whenever a municipality has a total nonresident valuation of 20% or more of the total valuation, upon request of any nonresident taxpayer, expending an amount not exceeding 20% of the total appropriations for town roads for maintenance and improvement of town roads which are largely used by nonresidents.**

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this Act is to benefit nonresidents in a municipality when at least 20% of the total valuation of the municipality is assessed against nonresidents.
