STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Operation of Snowmobiles in Cemeteries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 12, § 1978, sub-§ 9-A, additional. Section 1978 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 414 of the public laws of 1969, is amended by adding a new subsection 9-A, to read as follows:
- 9-A. Operation in cemeteries. It shall be unlawful to operate any snow-mobile in any cemetery or burying ground. Any person who violates this subsection shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$150, plus any damage to the memorials located in said cemetery, which was caused by snowmobiles.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to prevent damage now being done in cemeteries by persons who operate snowmobiles.
