STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Hunting on Lands of Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2401-B, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2401-B, to read as follows:

§ 2401-B. Hunting on Passamaquoddy lands

All non-Passamaquoddy persons hunting on the Passamaquoddy Indian Reservation lands shall be licensed by the tribal council at an annual fee of \$35. Non-Passamaquoddy persons may hunt only on Passamaquoddy Reservation lands if they employ an Indian guide at a rate of \$25 per day.

Passamaquoddy Reservation lands shall be posted for hunting by license only.

All fees and fines for violations of this section shall accrue to the tribal council for the Tribal Council Fund account.

The tribal council may adopt ordinances to carry out the purposes of this section.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to regulate hunting on Passamaquoddy Indian Reservation land by persons other than Passamaquoddy Indians.
