## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Directing the State Highway Commission to Complete State Highway No. 105.

Highway Commission directed to complete Highway 105. Resolved: That the Maine State Highway Commission is directed to complete the permanent construction of State Highway 105, starting from the end of such permanent construction in the Town of Windsor and continuing to the Somerville town line, a distance of approximately 1½ miles.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This section of State Highway 105 is the only portion of said state highway that has not yet been reconstructed. This road serves all residents of the Plantation of Somerville, all through traffic over Route 105 from Augusta to Camden, and many residents of the Town of Windsor and surrounding towns, who own and maintain summer cottages on Long Pond in the said Plantation of Somerville. Passage over this section of State Highway 105 is at times, especially during the fall and winter, dangerous and difficult.
