**RESOLVE, Appropriating Funds for Reconstructing Section of State
Highway No. 105.**

Reconstruction of section of highway No. 105; appropriation. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Highway Fund the sum of \$50,000 for the purpose of reconstructing that section in Windsor of state highway No. 105, ending at the Somerville town line, approximately 1.09 miles.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This section of state highway No. 105, running from Augusta to Camden, is the only section of said highway that has not been reconstructed.

The best estimate of the cost of completing this section of the road is approximately \$50,000.

This particular section of the highway is at times during the year not safe and convenient for normal use. This situation has been reviewed and a decree has already been issued to the Maine State Highway Commission by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Kennebec.

All this is a matter of record. It is felt by the citizens of the Town of Windsor, Kennebec County, and the citizens of the Plantation of Somerville, Lincoln County, that this state highway section should be improved on a permanent basis, by the Maine State Highway Commission as soon as possible.
