STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Retirement Allowance for Former Governors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 5, § 1121, sub-§ 11, additional. Section 1121 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new subsection 11, to read as follows:

Former Governors. Any person, who formerly served as Governor II. of this State and who has served in that capacity for a 4-year term or 2 or more 2-year terms and who has attained the age of 65 years, shall upon application to the board of trustees be granted an annual allowance of \$5,000. Said allowance shall become effective on the date that the board of trustees receives written application from such former Governor. Such adjustments as are granted under section 1128 shall be applied to these payments.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$8,750 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:
