**AN ACT Appropriating Funds to Survey the Boundaries of Passamaquoddy
Tribal Lands.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Survey to boundaries of Passamaquoddy tribal lands; appropriation. There is appropriated the sum of \$10,000 from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the accounts of the Indian Township Passamaquoddy Reservation Housing Authority and the Pleasant Point Passamaquoddy Reservation Housing Authority for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972, for the purpose of surveying the boundaries of the Passamaquoddy tribal lands. Any funds not expended at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse and not be carried forward. The breakdown shall be as follows:

STATEMENT OF FACT

Boundaries of the Passamaquoddy tribal lands in Washington County need to be surveyed to assist the Tribal Housing Authorities in the current and future activities pertaining to new housing and extension of water and sewerage construction on the reservations.

Economic expansion of activities on the reservations are also being considered for which exact boundary lines are necessary to determine exact locations.
