STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Increasing Compensation of Full-time Deputies in all Counties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 958, amended. Section 958 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as last amended by section 57-A of chapter 590 of the public laws of 1969, is further amended to read as follows:

§ 958. Full-time deputies in all counties; compensation

The sheriffs of all counties shall respectively appoint full-time deputy sheriffs, who shall serve at the pleasure of said respective sheriffs and whose special duty shall be to enforce the criminal laws in said counties and who shall receive as compensation therefor the sum of \$76 \$18 per day and such additional pay as the respective county commissioners may approve, to be paid from the respective county treasuries, together with such incidental expenses as may be necessary for the proper enforcement of said laws; bills for which shall be audited as provided in Title 15, section 1902. Such full-time deputy sheriffs shall not receive more than \$719 \$126 and chief deputies shall not receive more than \$119 \$130 in the aggregate for any one week, except that these limitations shall not apply to Androscoggin County, Cumberland County and York County.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The intent of this Act is to raise the compensation of full-time deputies in each county in keeping with other living costs.
