STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Use of Draggers in Part of New Meadows River, Sagadahoc and Cumberland Counties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1959, c. 155, § 73-B, additional. Chapter 155 of the private and special laws of 1959 is amended by adding a new section 73-B to read as follows:

Sec. 73-B. Use of draggers in certain waters in Sagadahoc and Cumberland Counties. It shall be unlawful to use a dragger or any other dragging apparatus, except standard scallop drags, for the taking of fish or lobsters in that part of Casco Bay and the New Meadows River, Sagadahoc and Cumberland Counties, inshore from a line drawn from the southern end of Small Point to northern end of Fuller Rock; thence to eastern end of White Bull; thence to southern end of Cundy's Point.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to prevent disturbing lobster beds in the water mentioned.
