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**AN ACT Relating to Hours of Business of Liquor Licensees on Election  
Days.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 28, § 4, amended.** The 3rd sentence of section 4 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is repealed as follows:

~~Liquor may be sold in any municipality on the day of holding a general election or state-wide primary only after the closing of the polls in such municipality.~~

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of the change is to allow licensees to remain open on election day whereas our neighboring states do so. It would result in increased revenue.
