STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Hours of Business of Liquor Licensees on Election Days.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 4, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 4 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is repealed as follows:

Liquor may be sold in any municipality on the day of holding a general election or state wide primary only after the closing of the polls in such municipality.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of the change is to allow licensees to remain open on election day whereas our neighboring states do so. It would result in increased revenue.
