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**AN ACT** Relating to Examinations for Certain Occupations  
by Graduates of Maine Vocational Technical Institutes.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 20, § 236I, additional.** Title 20 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 236I, to read as follows:

§ 236I. Graduates of vocational technical institutes

Any person who has satisfactorily completed a course of instruction at a Maine vocational technical institute in the practice of barbering, hairdressing and beauty culture, electrical installations, oil burner installations or plumbing shall be entitled to take the examination conducted by any of the respective boards and upon passage receive a certificate of registration or permit, provided such person has complied with all other requirements of any of the respective boards.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this legislation is to permit graduates of Maine vocational technical institutes, who have satisfactorily completed courses in certain occupations, to practice those occupations after having satisfactorily passed the respective examination.
