STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Affecting Unemployment Compensation During a Stoppage of Work Because of a Labor Dispute.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 26, § 1193, sub-§ 4, ¶¶ C and D, additional. Subsection 4 of section 1193 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 16 by chapter 381 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended by adding 2 new paragraphs C and D, to read as follows:
 - C. He has obtained employment subsequent to the beginning of the stoppage of work and has earned at least 8 times his weekly benefit amount or has been employed 4 full weeks.
 - D. The stoppage of work exists because of a lockout, then the disqualification shall be for the week in which the stoppage of work began and for the next 3 weeks unless the stoppage of work ceases.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to permit the payment of unemployment compensation to individuals who obtain new work during a stoppage of work because of a labor dispute where they were employed and subsequently became unemployed and to limit the present disqualification for unemployment compensation as a result of a stoppage of work because of an employer lock-out.
