STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Staffing the Joint Standing Committees of the Legislature.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 3, § 5, additional. Title 3 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 5 to read as follows:

§ 5. Legislative staff

Joint Standing Committees of the Legislature shall employ and be staffed by qualified undergraduate and graduate students from Maine colleges and universities and academic credit for such temporary employment shall be optional with the various institutions of higher learning within the State.

The Law and Reference Librarian at the Maine State Library and the Director of Legislative Research may also employ at their discretion such students during the course of the legislative session.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$50,000 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:
