STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Payment for Sales of Malt Liquor or Table Wine in Retail Stores.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows.

R. S., T. 28, § 751-A, amended. Section 751-A of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 91 of the public laws of 1967, and as last repealed and replaced by section 51 of chapter 590 of the public laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

§ 751-A. Payment for sales in retail stores

For the purpose of receiving payment at the check-out counters for the sale of malt liquor or table wine in retail stores, the age of such employee receiving the payment shall not be under 17 years of age for malt liquor and 18 years for table wine provided that an employee who is 20 years of age or older is present in the retail store in a supervisory capacity.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to permit persons who are not under 17 years of age to receive payment at check-out counters for the sale of malt liquor or table wine in retail stores without an older employee being present.
