**AN ACT Permitting the State Park and Recreation Commission to Sell
Snowmobile Trail Marking Signs and Charts.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 1972, amended. Section 1972 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 414 of the public laws of 1969, is amended by inserting before the last sentence the following new sentence:

The State Park and Recreation Commission may charge a reasonable fee for said services and materials when the moneys credited to it under this paragraph are insufficient to satisfy the demand for said services and materials. All fees so collected shall be deposited in the State Park and Recreation Snowmobile Trail Fund.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the purpose of this amendment to allow the State Park and Recreation Commission to charge a reasonable fee for the marking and clearing of snowmobile trails and providing maps and trail charts and other educational and informational materials for the benefit of persons conducting a profit making snowmobile business or operation and to charge a reasonable fee for services and materials to certain others.
