## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

#### AN ACT Relating to Expert Witness Fees as Court Costs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 16, § 251, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 251 of Title 16 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The court in its discretion may allow at the trial of any cause, civil or criminal, in said Supreme Judicial Court or the Superior Court, a reasonable sum not exceeding \$50 per day for the each day's attendance of any expert witness or witnesses at said trial, in taxing the costs of the prevailing party, except that and the expense of all expert witnesses for the State in murder cases shall be in such amounts as the presiding justice shall allow and shall be paid by the State and charged against the appropriation for the Department of the Attorney General.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide reasonable expenses for expert witnesses.
