STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Membership of Board of Trustees for Accident and Health Insurance Program for State Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 5, § 285, sub-§ 2, amended. The 2nd sentence of subsection 2 of section 285 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 543 of the public laws of 1967, is amended to read as follows:

The provisions of such group insurance policy or policies shall be determined by a board of trustees consisting of $\frac{1}{5}$ 6 members, 2 of whom shall be appointed by the Maine State Employees Association; one of whom shall be a retired state employee selected by a majority vote of the Presidents of the Chapters of the Retired State Employees Association; one of whom shall be appointed by Council 74 of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees; and 2 state employees who shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Council.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the intent of the Legislature to use the resources of computerized data of the national union, The American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, of which Council 74 is its Maine affiliate, in matters pertaining to accident and health insurance programs. It is also the further intent of the Legislature not to discriminate against Council 74, even though their state employee membership is less than the Maine State Employees Association. Council 74 does, however, represent a majority of municipal employees in Maine.
