STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Shrimp in Frenchmans Bay.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1959, c. 155, § 32-A, additional. Chapter 155 of the private and special laws of 1959, as amended, is further amended by adding a new section 32-A to read as follows:

Sec. 32-A. Taking of shrimp in Frenchmans Bay. It shall be unlawful to take shrimp by any method from any of the waters northerly and inside of a line drawn from a point of land on the south side of Bunker Cove, in the Town of Gouldsboro, westerly to the most southerly point of Stave Island, thence to the northern point of The Hop Island, thence in a straight line to the north side of Bar Island, and thence to the Ferry Terminal on the Bar Harbor shore. Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This Act would make it illegal to take shrimp by any method within the described waters.
