STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Advisory Council to the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 1955, amended. The first 2 sentences of section 1955 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes are amended to read as follows:

An advisory council, as heretofore appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Council, shall consist of 78 members, chosen one from each of the following councilor districts and a resident of the district represented: First District, Aroostook, Washington; Second District, Penobscot, Piscataquis; Third District, Somerset, Franklin; Fourth District, Oxford, Androscoggin; Fifth District, Cumberland, York; Sixth District, Sagadahoc, Lincoln; Seventh District, Knox, Waldo; Eighth District, Kennebec, Hancock. Appointment shall be for the terms of 63 years and until successors are appointed and qualified.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The intent of this Act is to provide better area representation on the advisory council and shorter terms for members, leading to new ideas and views.
