**AN ACT Repealing the Law Relating to State Licenses for Those
Discriminating on Account of Race or Religion.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 1301-A, repealed. Section 1301-A of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 371 of the public laws of 1969, and as amended by section 24-G of chapter 504 of the public laws of 1969, is repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This discrimination law is now being tested in the courts as to its constitutionality. The purpose of this bill is to prevent undue hardship on many Maine licensees until the court decision is final.
