COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to S. P. 257, L. D. 763, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Geographically Isolated Small High Schools."

Amend said Bill by striking out everything after the amending clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'<u>10. Size.</u> Any public school enrolling fewer than 100 pupils may be approved by the State Board of Education on an emergency <u>or continuing</u> basis only after the school committee or board of directors have presented in detail reasons for such emergency <u>or continuing</u> approval. <u>Any such school which</u> <u>is adjudged by the board to be geographically isolated shall</u> <u>receive the board's approval for a 6-year period subject to</u> <u>the right of the board to terminate its approval, on the ground</u> <u>of size, only if the school receives at least 5-years' notice</u> <u>of such termination, and subject also to the satisfactory meeting</u> in every case of the other requirements of this section.'

Statement of Fact

The intent of this amendment is to provide additional aid for the very small high schools where per pupil expenditures are considerably above state average because of its geographic isolation and to allow the state board to approve continued operation for a period of years.
