STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Prohibiting Administering Behavioral and Tranquilizing Drugs in Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 20, § 572, additional. Title 20 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 572 to read as follows:

§ 572. Drugs prohibited

It is unlawful for any person to give drugs to school children at nursery, kindergarten, elementary or secondary school levels or at any other schools in the State of Maine, for the purpose of modifying the learning or behavior of the students.

It is unlawful to administer tranquilizing drugs of any type, kind or of any description to school children by teaching personnel, or by any school nurse, or by any other school employee or by administrators of schools, whether public or private.

This section shall not apply to mentally-retarded children who are under the supervision of a licensed physician or to those children who are in the custody of the Department of Mental Health and Corrections.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to insure that the school rooms of our great State of Maine are not turned into a massive clinic, leading to children's acceptance of drugs as a way of life.
