AN ACT Increasing Salaries of Full-time Deputy Sheriffs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 958, amended. The last sentence of section 958 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

Such full-time deputy sheriffs shall ~~not receive more than \$112 a weekly salary of \$132~~ and chief deputies shall ~~not receive more than \$119 in the aggregate for any one week receive a weekly salary of \$139~~, except that these limitations shall not apply to Androscoggin County, Cumberland County and York County.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to insure full-time deputy sheriffs a salary equal to that of patrolmen in most departments who now work 40 hours as compared to unlimited hours of deputies; the salary of the chief deputy to at least equal that of sergeants.
