AN ACT Relating to Number of Examinations for Admission to the Bar.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 4, § 805, amended. The 2nd, 3rd and 4th sentences of the last paragraph of section 805 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, are repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to liberalize the number of times an applicant for admission to the bar may take the examination.
